# Our Preschool

Our preschool is an owner operated service that specialises in offering your child a safe and stimulating learning environment with a family atmosphere. We offer small group numbers with high ratios of qualified staff as we know that children learn best when they are given opportunities to work with educators one-on-one. This structure allows us opportunities to take on meaningful projects that go beyond just learning. The children acquire knowledge that can be put into practice outside the preschool, in the community and at home.

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# Welcome

Welcome to Young Einstein Preschool. Our preschool is located in Anstead surrounded by nature and wildlife. The service can be accessed via the Mount Crosby Service Road. We accept enrolments for children aged between 2.5 - 5 years who are toilet trained. Our preschool provides a kindergarten program which differs from other programs available in our area. We are a small service with the capacity of 19 enrolments, which enables us to deliver a unique and personalised program. We foster inquiry based pedagogy where children develop problem solving skills and learn to make real-life connections through investigations. Children are given opportunities throughout the year to be involved in productions and to complete meaningful projects that enhance their creativity and learning.

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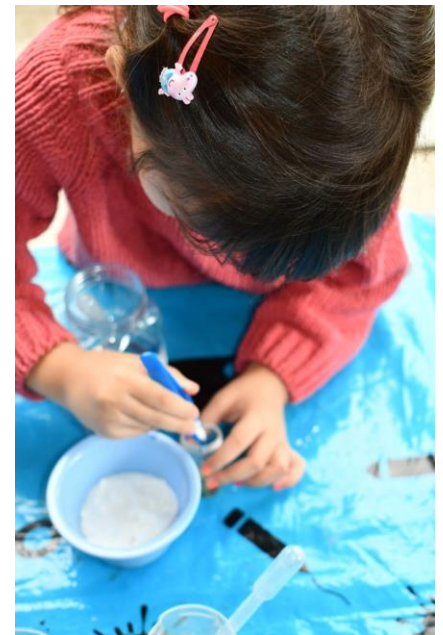

These projects give purpose to the children's learning and enhances their ability to design, be creative, build and manipulate objects.



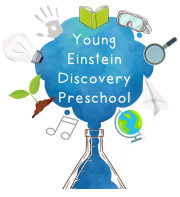
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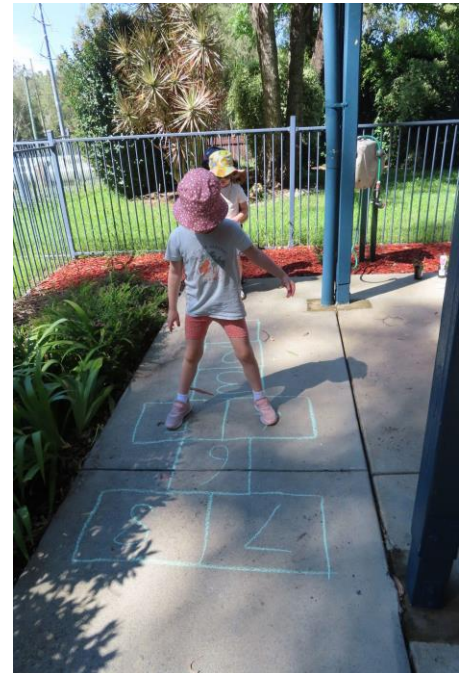
# Fundamental Movement Skills Program

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# Our Playground Philosophy

The space allows children to engage in a variety of risky, creative and natural play experiences.



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# Preschool Philosophy

We connect with families as we welcome them into our learning space each morning. It is during this interaction that families and teachers can gain a deeper understanding of the needs of individual children. We provide an inclusive environment and our preschool promotes Indigenous culture, additional needs and cultural diversity. We ensure that our services are accessible and equitable for all users. We create a safe and inviting atmosphere where we nurture every child's uniqueness and curiosity. Our educators set up stimulating spaces and inquiries that ignite discovery, imagination, and exploration. We use a wide variety of natural, recycled, open-ended and quality education resources for children to explore and experiment with.

We expose children to core curriculum and active, sensory, and creative experiences that promote their personal progress. Our preschool highly values respect and responsibility and we embed these values into all interactions with the children. We encourage risk taking, problem solving and personal independence in a controlled and safe environment. Our teachers model positive relationships with the children and support positive interactions from child to child. We believe that kindness, empathy, and fairness need to be taught so that children have the skills to maintain healthy relationships now and

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in their future. We respectfully acknowledge the rights of the child and advocate for their safety and wellbeing.

Our Preschool adopts reflective practices to continually make improvements to our service. We work in partnerships with staff, families, and our local community to provide a service that is valued by all. The staff employed at our preschool are highly qualified and demonstrate ongoing training to strive to provide quality services. We aim to always maintain the continuity of educators so that children feel safe and secure and staff are able to confidently follow all policies and procedures. Our staff conduct themselves professionally and ethically and are positive role models for the families who use our service.

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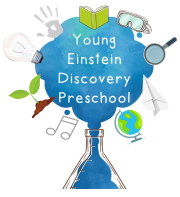

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# Fees and Attendance

## Fees

Preschool Program daily fees are **\$107** per day.

Early Starters daily fees are **\$117** per day

The service is Child Care Subsidy approved and families may be entitled to Child Care Subsidies from the government. Our preschool delivers a Queensland Kindergarten approved learning program.

Our preschool uses **Xplor software** to complete enrolments and issue fortnightly invoices which are paid via direct deposit. Families are able to download the Xplor Home app via IOS or Android to access realtime information about their child and account.



At the time of enrolment a charge of \$20 is required for administration of new enrolments.

All payments are to be made using the Xplor App with the 'Pay Now' or 'Direct Debit' features.



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## Preschool Hours

The preschool offers care from 8am – 4pm for children aged 2.5 - 5 years. Early Starters care is available on request from 7.30am - 8am however, numbers are limited and charges apply. The preschool is open for 48 weeks a year and is closed for public holidays, Easter and 4 week period during mid December and early January. Exact dates are given to families in advance.

## Attendance

The children undertake special projects and performances throughout the year and to be able to participate fully in the curriculum we require children to be enrolled to attend preschool for a minimum of 2 days attendance each week.

If your child is unwell they may be excluded from attending the service due to infectious illnesses or diseases. Please refer to the Queensland Department of Health - Time Out Poster for further information (page 18).

All absences need to be reported to preschool staff to maintain our duty of care. Any absences throughout the year are chargeable. This includes illnesses, family holidays and decisions made by families to finish the school year early.

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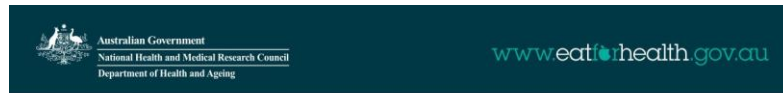
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# Healthy Eating

### Keeping your child and other kids healthy!

- Information for a number of infectious conditions that may require<sup>1</sup> exclusion of children from school, education and care services.
- Additional public health recommendations that apply to children and adults.
- To assist medical practitioners, schools, preschools and childcare facilities to meet the public health requirements<sup>1</sup> and recommendations.

\*Refers to contagious conditions as per the Public Health Regulation 2008.

1. Observing the exclusion period meets the intent of the Public Health Act 2005 for a person to be non-infectious. See schedule 4 of the Public Health Regulation 2008 for a complete list of contagious conditions and their exclusion criteria.
2. Doctors should notify the local Public Health Unit as soon as possible if children or staff are diagnosed with these conditions. Refer to page 2 for Public Health Unit contact details.

Condition	Person with the infection	Those in contact with the infected person (The definition of 'contact' will vary between diseases)
*Chickenpox (varicella)	<b>EXCLUDE</b> until all blisters have dried, and at least 5 days after the onset of symptoms. <sup>1</sup>	<b>EXCLUSION MAY APPLY</b> <b>EXCLUDE</b> non-immune pregnant women and any child with immune deficiency or receiving chemotherapy. Advise to seek urgent medical assessment. Contact your Public Health Unit for specialist advice. Also see Shingles information below.
Cold sores (herpes simplex)	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b> if the person can maintain hygiene practices to minimise the risk of transmission. Young children unable to comply with good hygiene practices should be excluded while sores are weeping. Sores should be covered with a dressing where possible.	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>
Conjunctivitis	<b>EXCLUDE</b> until discharge from eyes has ceased unless a doctor has diagnosed non-infectious conjunctivitis.	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>
*COVID-19 <sup>2</sup>	<b>EXCLUDE</b> those who have symptoms and relevant contacts. <sup>1</sup> See latest Queensland Health guidance for exclusion periods and criteria. Contact your Public Health Unit for specialist advice.	<b>EXCLUSION MAY APPLY</b> Contact your Public Health Unit for specialist advice.
Cytomegalovirus (CMV)	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b> pregnant women should consult with their doctor.	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b> pregnant women should consult with their doctor.
<b>Diarrhoea and/or Vomiting</b> Including: • amoebiasis • campylobacter • cryptosporidium giardia • rotavirus • salmonella • gastroenteritis <b>but excluding:</b> • norovirus • shigellosis • toxin-producing forms of E.coli (STEC)	Exclusion periods may vary depending on the cause. <b>EXCLUDE</b> a single case until the person, has no symptoms <sup>1</sup> (includes vomiting if applicable), is feeling well and they have not had any loose bowel motions for at least 24 hours or if the person has confirmed norovirus exclude for at least 48 hours. <sup>2</sup> <b>EXCLUDE</b> all persons who prepare or serve food until they have not had any diarrhoea or vomiting for 48 hours. <b>NOTE:</b> If there are 2 or more cases with diarrhoea and/or vomiting in the same location, which may indicate a potential outbreak OR a single case in a food handler, notify your Public Health Unit. <b>Diarrhoea:</b> 5 or more loose stools or bowel movements in a 24 hour period that are different from normal and/or escapes a child's nappy. *Enterovirus 71 (EV71 neurological disease)	<b>EXCLUDE</b> until written medical clearance is received confirming the virus is no longer present in the person's bowel motions. <sup>1</sup>	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>
Fungal infections of the skin and nails (ringworm/tinea)	<b>EXCLUDE</b> until the day after antifungal treatment has commenced. (No exclusion for thrush).	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>
Glandular fever (mononucleosis, Epstein-Barr virus)	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>

Hand, foot and mouth disease	<b>EXCLUDE</b> until all blisters have dried.	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>
Head lice	Exclusion is not necessary if effective treatment is commenced before next attendance day (i.e. the child does not need to be sent home immediately if head lice are detected).	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b>
*Hepatitis A <sup>2</sup>	<b>EXCLUDE</b> until at least 7 days after the onset of jaundice. <sup>1</sup> OR for 2 weeks after onset of first symptoms, including dark urine if there is no jaundice. If a person is asymptomatic, contact your Public Health Unit for Specialist advice.	<b>NOT EXCLUDED</b> Contact your Public Health Unit for specialist advice about vaccination or treatment for children and staff in the same room or group, children transferring to another centre and new enrolments.

Shingles (herpes zoster)	<b>EXCLUDE</b> all children until blisters have dried and crusted. <b>EXCLUDE</b> adults if blisters are unable to be covered. <b>NOT EXCLUDED</b> in adults if blisters can be covered with a waterproof dressing until they have dried.	<b>EXCLUSION MAY APPLY</b> Contact your Public Health Unit for specialist advice, including advice for pregnant women and any person who is immuno-compromised (including receiving chemotherapy).
